## 2024 ANNUAL REPORT

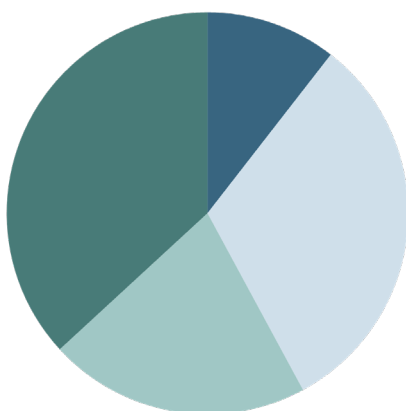


Pivot Point Center for Youth provides residential treatment in a supportive, home-like setting for girls in Clark County who are either completing placement or awaiting adjudication by the Court. The program partners with The Embracing Project (TEP), a local drop-in center that provides a broad network of services, including clinical support, independent living skills, high school education, employment readiness, advocacy, and mentoring.

Youth at Pivot Point receive individualized, comprehensive care and participate in a variety of evidence-based interventions. These include Girls Circle, Thinking for a Change (T4C), Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), anger management, and both individual and family therapy.

Race

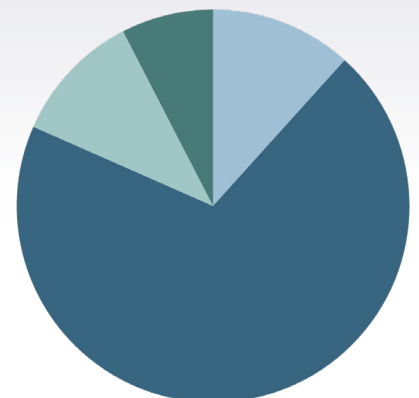

### 2024 OUTCOMES

- 16 years old was the average age in 2024
- 100% of discharges were successful exits
- 27.8 average family contacts per month
- 86.3% of families participated in the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) process
